#### 1. RECEIPT OF PUBLIC COMMENTS.

Arnell Rusanyanwa thanked the Board for item 4 on the agenda recognizing Assemblymember Calderon for her efforts.

At this time Director Martinez joined the meeting.

Adriana Quinones thanked the Board for hosting the meeting at 5:30 pm. She asked if the Board would consider moving its meeting times to 6:00 p.m. or 7 pm. to allow for more public attendance, and also asked if any town-hall-type of meeting is planned to introduce the agency to the community.

Lucy Pedregon expressed concern for restoration efforts during the drought, and its use of chemicals, and possible impacts to wildlife. She expressed support for an idea of providing water for the wildlife.

Deputy Chief Ranger Hughes reviewed these reports. He added that there was extensive preparation for the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday, and successfully there were no fires. He updated the Board on a variety of items. Board Members thanked the rangers for their efforts.

The Board received and filed the item.

4. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF AUTHORITY RESOLUTION 2022-12, A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO DEDICATE SYCAMORE CANYON STREAM IN HONOR OF ASSEMBLYMEMBER LISA CALDERON IN APPRECIATION OF HER EFFORTS TO SUPPORT THE AUTHORITY.

Chair Sulic reviewed this item, and thanked Assemblymember Calderon for her valuable support. The other Board Members also expressed their appreciation and support.

Director Hughes motioned to approve Resolution 2022-12 dedicating Sycamore Canyon Stream in honor of Assemblymember Calderon. Vice Chair Ferrante Director seconded this motion, and in a roll call vote the motion passed unanimously.

5. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING CHANGING THE REGULAR MEETING TIME FOR THE AUTHORITY BOARD MEETINGS.

Chair Sulic introduced this item. Director Martinez expressed that a later meeting time conflicts with her other meetings. Vice Chair Ferrante stated that if the meeting time is changed and the Board meets in person, that would require the Sanitation Districts' staff services to be extended to accommodate the later hours at the facility where the meetings are held. There was discussion. Chair Sulic tabled this item for additional consideration.

Executive Director Gullo introduced this item, and explained Options 1-3 in the staff report. There was discussion.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board adopt the attached resolution, 2022-14.

#### Background:

The attached resolution is provided for your consideration to be in compliance with Assembly Bill 361 which was signed into law on September 16, 2021 and made effective on October 1, 2021. AB 361 allows continued remote teleconference meetings without traditional Brown Act compliance, provided certain findings can be made related to the ongoing state of emergency and subject to adherence to certain new noticing and public participation requirements.

No later than 30 days after teleconferencing for the first time under AB 361 rules, and every 30 days thereafter, the Board must adopt a resolution making the required findings of necessity to continue conducting public meetings remotely in reliance on AB 361 and affirming the measures in place to allow remote public comments by the public.

It has been approximately 29 days from the adoption of the Authority's 2022-11 resolution which was approved at the last Board meeting on September 22, 2022 and valid through October 21, 2022, so the attached is a new subsequent resolution extending the timeframe for virtual meetings through November 18, 2022.

#### Resolution No. 2022-14

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE PUENTE HILLS HABITAT PRESERVATION AUTHORITY PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY PERSISTS AND RE-AUTHORIZING THE USE OF REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETING PROCEDURES BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND ALL STANDING COMMITTEES FOR THE PERIOD OCTOBER 20, 2022 THROUGH NOVEMBER 18, 2022, AS AUTHORIZED BY GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953(E) *ET SEQ*.

WHEREAS, the Puente Hills Habitat Preservation Authority (the "Authority") is committed to preserving and nurturing public access, transparency, observation and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors (the "Board") and each of its standing committees; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the Board and standing committees are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act, codified in Government Code sections 54950 *et seq.*, so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and observe the Board and standing committees conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, as amended by Assembly Bill 361 (2021), codified in Government Code sections 54953(e) *et seq.*, allows for remote teleconferencing observation and participation in meetings by members of a legislative body and members of the public, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3) regarding teleconferencing, subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the initial required condition is that the meeting is held during a state of emergency that has been declared by the Governor pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act at Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state and within the boundaries of the Authority, caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, pursuant to Government Code section 8625, Governor Newsom declared the existence of a state of emergency for the State of California, which includes area within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Authority, in response to the outbreak of respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, also on March 4, 2020, the County of Los Angeles followed suit and declared the existence of a state of emergency for the County of Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq*. further requires that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or, the legislative body of the Authority finds that meeting in person would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the Board previously adopted Resolution No. 2022-11 on September 22, 2022, finding that the requisite conditions exist for the Board and all standing committees of the Authority to conduct remote teleconference meetings without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3), as authorized by Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of extending the use of the remote teleconference meeting procedures provided in Government Code section 54953(e), the Board must reconsider the circumstances of the state of emergency, and as of the date of this Resolution, the Board has done so; and

WHEREAS, a state of emergency persists, as initially identified and described by the Governor in the proclamation of the existence of a state of emergency for the State of California in response to the outbreak of respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID-19) issued on March 4, 2020, pursuant to Government Code section 8625; and

WHEREAS, State of California and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing, as reflected by (without limitation) current State and County Public Health Officer Orders and related orders and guidance; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds that the emergency conditions persist in the Authority, such that meeting in person for the meetings of the Board and standing committees of the Authority would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees as a result of the increased risk of the spread of the COVID-19 virus among those in attendance; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds that the state of emergency due to the COVID-19 virus and the conditions related thereto has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons within the Authority that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the Authority, and thereby reaffirms, reauthorizes, and continues the existence of a local emergency and ratifies state and local orders for social distancing; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds that, as a consequence of the local emergency persisting and the imposed or recommended social distancing measures, the Board and standing committees of the Authority shall conduct their meetings without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3), and shall instead comply with the remote teleconference meeting requirements as authorized by Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Board affirms that it will allow for observation and participation by Board Members, Advisory Committee Members and the public via video and/or telephone, in an effort to protect the constitutional and statutory rights of all attendees.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE PUENTE HILLS HABITAT PRESERVATION AUTHORITY FINDS, RESOLVES, AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Board hereby reconsiders the conditions of the state of emergency as proclaimed by the Governor, the existence of emergency conditions in the Authority, and reaffirms, reauthorizes, and continues the existence of a local emergency throughout the Authority.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Board finds that holding the meetings of the Board and standing committees of the Authority in person continues to present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees as a result of the increased risk of the spread of the COVID-19 virus among those in attendance, as required by Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.* 

<u>Section 4.</u> Further, the Board finds that the State of California and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing; and

<u>Section 5.</u> The Executive Director is hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution, including, continuing to conduct open and public meetings remotely in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act, for all Board meetings and all standing committee meetings of the Authority.

Section 6. ## Puente Hills Habitat Preservation Authority Ranger Services Activities for September 2022

- Continued general patrol for: providing visitor information, identifying hazardous conditions and correcting illegal activity.
- Continued general maintenance for: graffiti removal, vandalism repair, litter and dumping removal, fence and gate repairs, sign installations and repairs and trail maintenance.
- Monitoring the Conservation Corp from Long Beach clearing the fire roads within the Preserve.
- Met with the new La Habra Heights Fire Marshal.
- Participated in the Puente Hills Habitat Preservation Authority (Habitat Authority) Board meeting. Gave a report on ranger services
- Participated in the Habitat Authority monthly management meeting.
- Participated in our ranger monthly management meeting.
- Replaced the old "Preserve hours" banners at Sycamore Canyon and the Hacienda Hills Trailhead.
- Monitoring the contractor with the goats for the vegetation management project in Turnbull Canyon.
- Picked up dumping including:
  - Construction debris at Arroyo San Miguel.
  - Wood pile at Powder Canyon.
- Continue to notify the Habitat Authority staff of all unsuccessful animal road crossings that are observed at or near Habitat Authority property. During the month of September no animals were observed.
- Continue to monitor the Harbor underpass. Picked up trash and cleaned graffiti.

- Continue to patrol the SCE, Brea 57 site and Monterey mitigation sites in Powder Canyon and the Olinda site in Arroyo San Miguel.
- Due to safety concerns and overcrowding at the Turnbull Canyon entrance, we previously worked with the owner of the property and Whittier Police Dept. to secure the vacant lot that is next to the entrance. The lot was secure for all of September.
- Continue monitoring the surveillance cameras at various trailheads in attempt to catch the vehicle break-in perpetrators. We are also coordinating with Whittier Police and L.A. County Sheriff. The City of Whittier installed several warning signs advising hikers not to keep valuables in the vehicle.
- Continue to contact the Los Angles County Department of Street Maintenance regarding the graffiti along Turnbull Canyon Road.
- Scheduled the second roadside clearance for La Habra Heights as part of the fuel modification contract.
- Contact with a homeless person at Arroyo Pescadero. Warned and advised about the Preserve rules.
- Continue to check and re-post trail closure signs and rope-fence at unauthorized trails and restoration areas in Turnbull Canyon, Worsham Canyon, Powder Canyon and Hellman Park.
- Dealt with various violations including:
  - In the Preserve after hours at Sycamore Canyon, Hacienda Hills, Powder Cyn. and Arroyo Pescadero.
  - Parking violations at Arroyo Pescadero, Hacienda Hills Trailhead,
     Sycamore Canyon and Ford property.
  - Loud music in the Hacienda Hills and Arroyo Pescadero.
  - Subject collecting flowers on the Diaz property.
  - Marijuana at Arroyo Pescadero and Turnbull Canyon.
  - Smoking at Arroyo Pescadero.
  - Alcohol in Arroyo Pescadero and Turnbull Canyon.
  - Warn and advise electric bikes in Powder Canyon and Hacienda Hills.
  - Dogs off leash at Hacienda Hills and Arroyo Pescadero.
  - Bikes in Arroyo Pescadero.
- Monitored the air conditioning repairs at the Sycamore Canyon house.
- Continue to pick up dog defecation at all the trailheads.
- Continue to conduct perimeter patrols of all property for fence damage, illegal access points, rope swings, and encroachments.

  - Inquiry is Sycamore Canyon is open.

#### Recommendation:

#### Background:

At the April 8, 2022 Authority Board meeting, action was taken by the Board to delay proceeding with a financing mechanism and to proceed with hiring a financial services advisor. At the May 2022 Board meeting action was taken to enter into a contract with Fieldman, Rolapp and Associates. Their work includes financial analysis and forecasting, as well as a projection of annual funding needs for the Authority should it decide to pursue a financing mechanism.

Staff and Authority accounting consultant Lance, Soll & Lunghard, LLP provided background information such as audits, financial statements, and end of the year budgets to the Fieldman, Rolapp and Associates for them to analyze the financial solvency of the agency. Their findings which show a structural deficit will be presented at the meeting for Board discussion and possible action. Possible next steps could involve seeking professional assistance with facilitating community outreach or education to explore the matter further.
